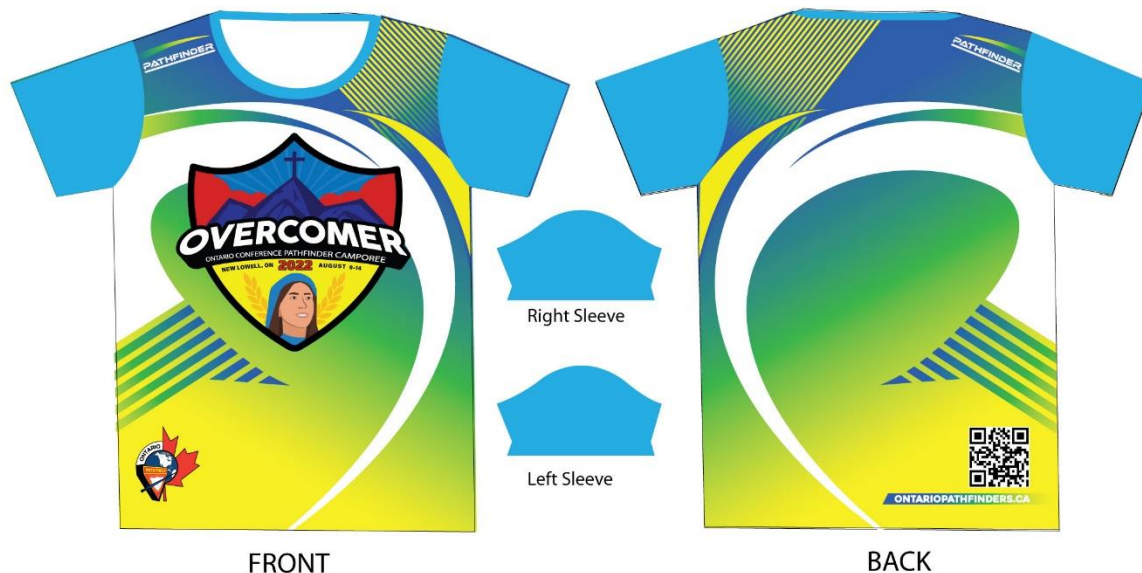

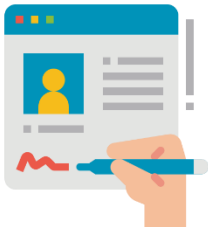


MEDICAL INFO & LIABILITY RELEASE FORM

All campers (i.e., Pathfinders, leaders, staff, volunteers, parents, staff children, visitors, etc.) should complete the **Medical Information and Liability Release Form**. Without it, no one will be admitted to camp. Original forms should be completed and signed by parents or legal guardians of Pathfinders, compiled alphabetically in a binder to be presented upon arrival at the gate and subsequently submitted to the *First Aid Team* at the camporee headquarters. Remember, on-site check-in will not be complete without this binder. **(Medical form link) (Disclosure form link)**

Please make three (3) photocopies of the original form to be provided to the following:

- a. Club Director
- b. Camporee Headquarters
- c. Pathfinder (to be placed in a pouch together with the Pathfinder passport). Rest assured, these forms will be treated with much confidentiality.



ON-SITE CHECK-IN

On-site check-in and camp set-up will be on **Tuesday, August 9, 2022**, from 09:00 to 17:00. As soon club directors arrive at Camp New Lowell, they should report to the camporee headquarters (HQ) for on-site check-in/registration.

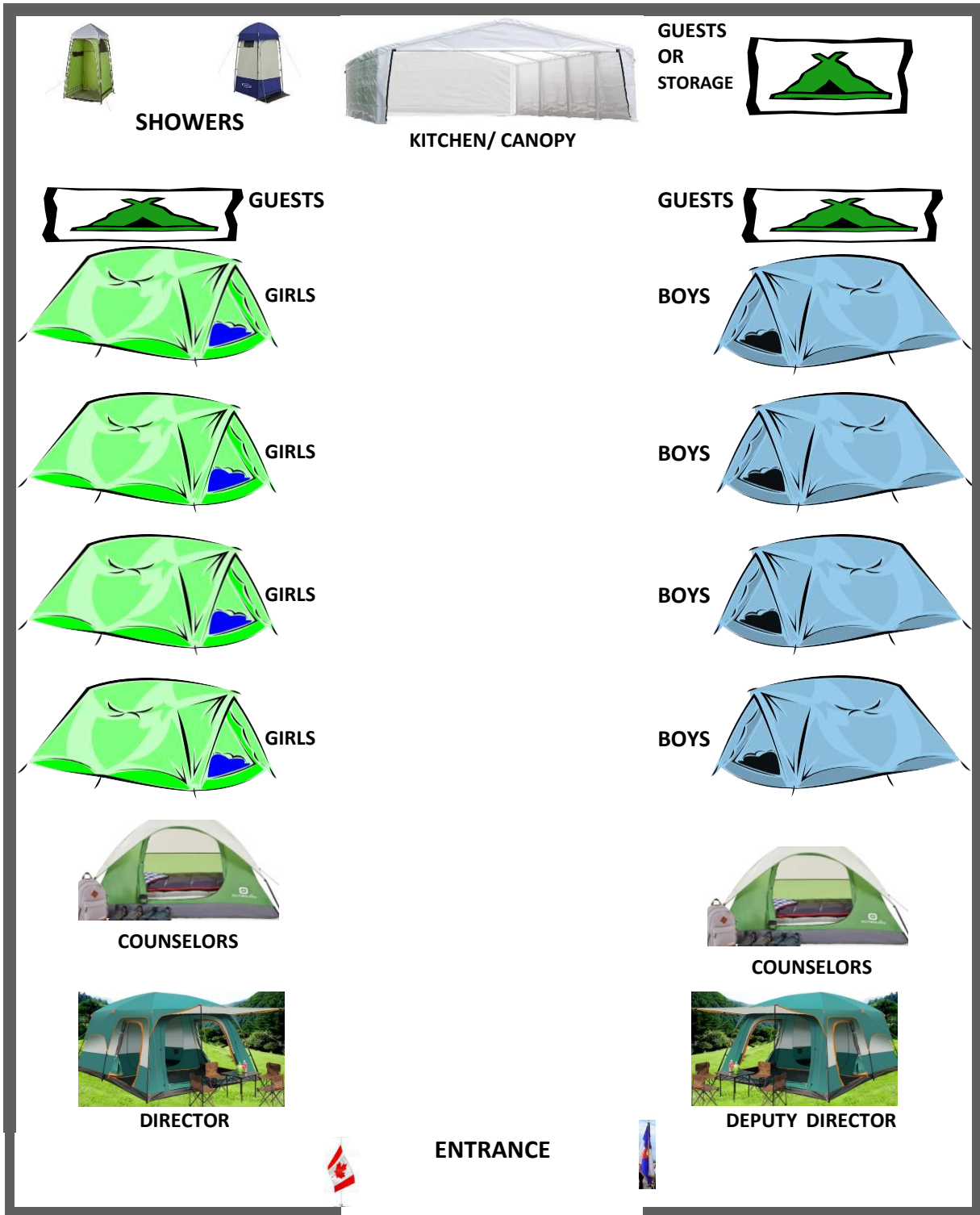
Completed and signed **Medical Information and Liability Release and the Videography/Photography Release forms** should be submitted to the designated duty officer at HQ. Without these forms, no club will be admitted to camporee. Points will be awarded to clubs for on-time on-site registration and camp set-up if completed by 17:00 on **Tuesday, August 9, 2022**.



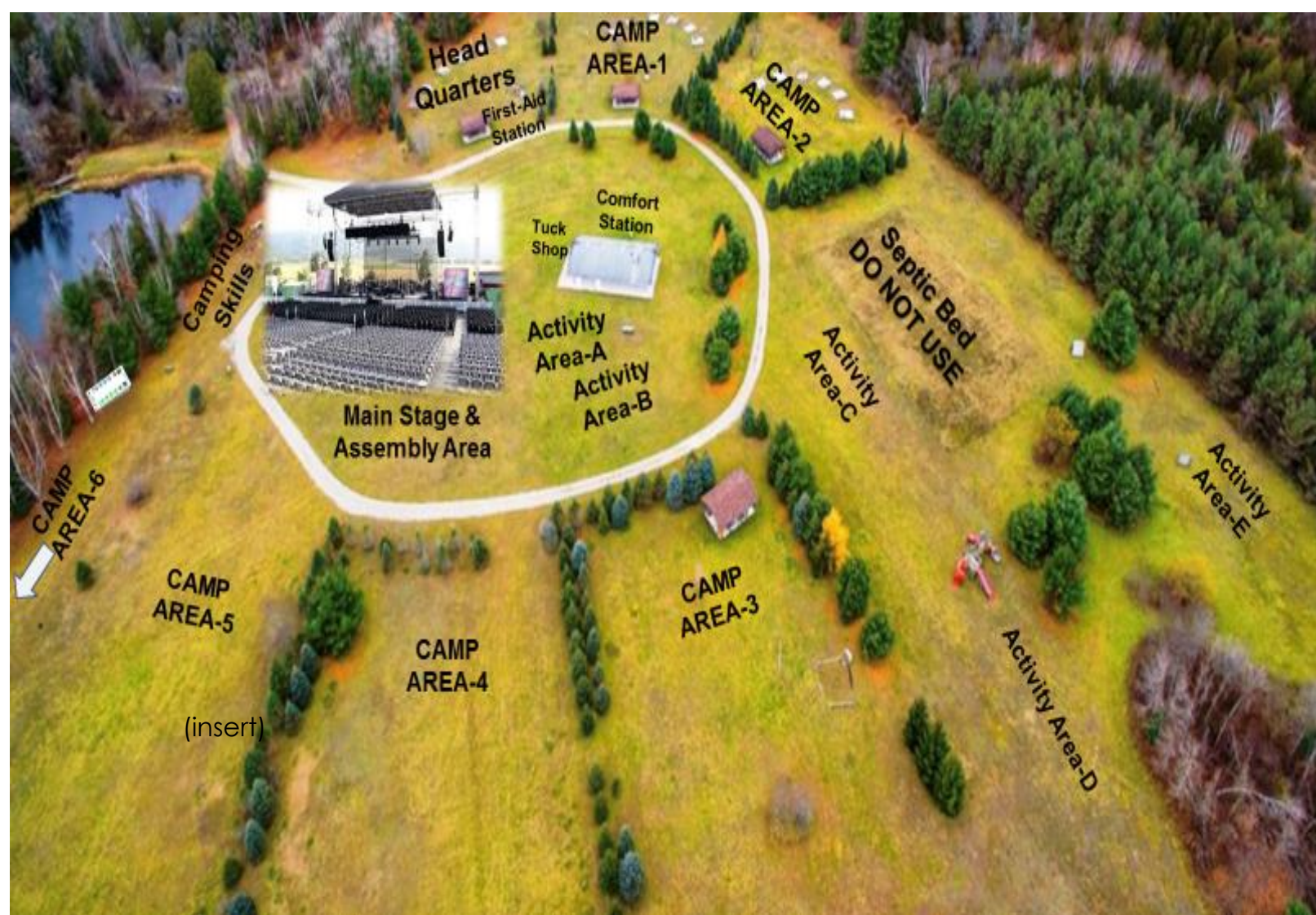
CAMP ENTRANCE & FURNITURE

Campsite entrance for each club should be lashed using ropes to fasten wood and other natural materials (no nails and screws). As for the camp furniture, two (2) usable pieces would be required (i.e., table and chair). All camp furniture must be lashed by the Pathfinders themselves using natural wood and either Manila or sisal ropes. *(Please do not cut down any trees or remove dead wood from forested area to make furniture)*. Material must be of natural wood or pre-cut if access to natural wood is not possible. Wood can be bought from garden centres or other places.

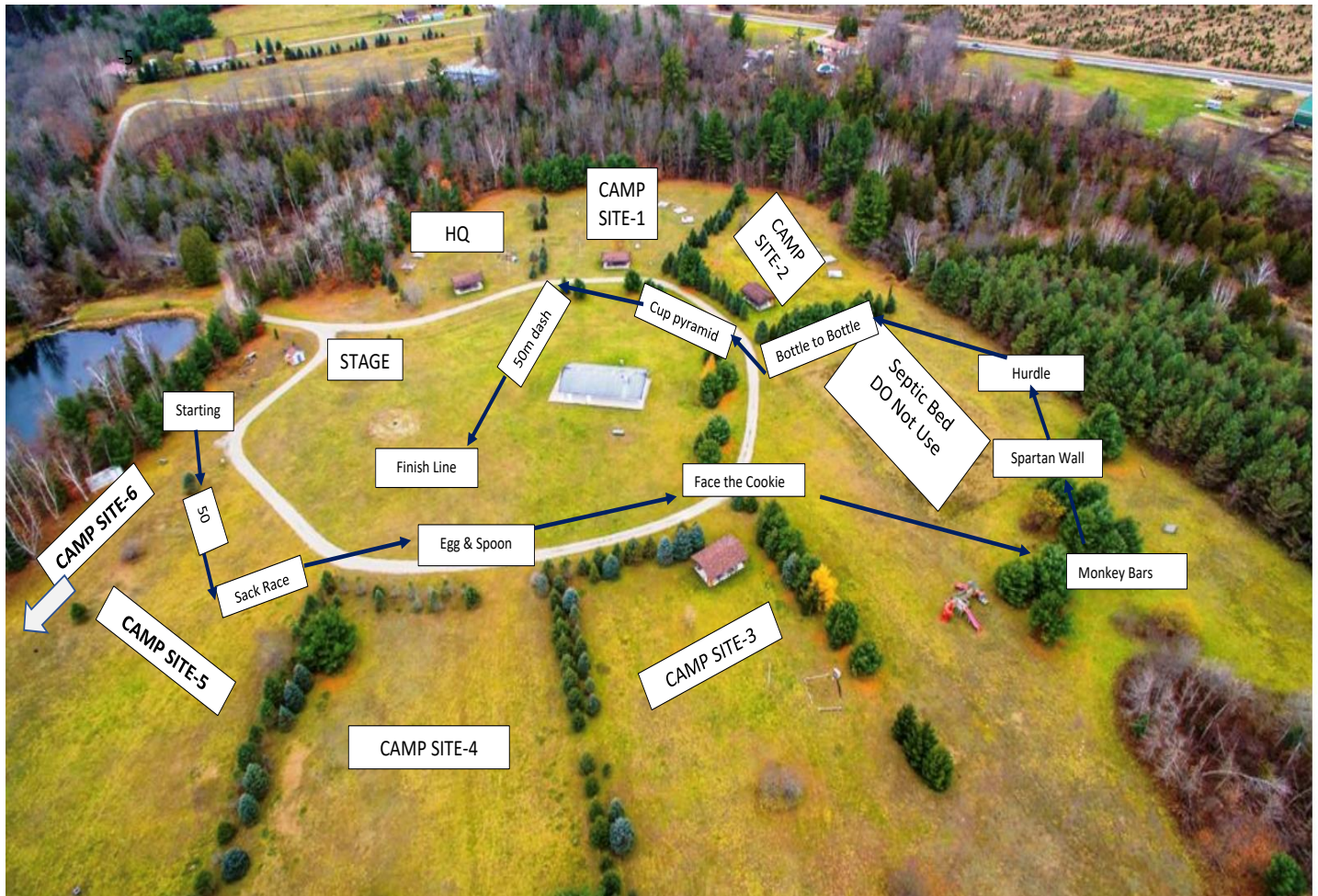

OVERCOMER CHALLENGE

The overcome challenge will be taking place on Friday, August 12 from 13:00 -17:00. This challenge is a relay race that will test your skills as you compete against other clubs. Each club needs to register 10 Pathfinder before August 3, 2022.





CAMP PARKING

Only one vehicle will be allowed to park on each campground for storage purposes. No motorcycles are allowed on the campsite. All other vehicles must be parked at the designated parking area.



CAMP SAFETY & SECURITY

For the safety of all campers, it is imperative that security teams are on-duty round the clock. Thus, the help of as many adult volunteers as possible is needed. All able-bodied people from each club are encouraged to sign up and be a part of the camporee security team. Points will be awarded to clubs for their volunteer work in the area of camporee security.

Entrance to Camp New Lowell will be supervised and attended 24 hours a day. The main gate will be closed as per schedule and guards will be posted. No one will be allowed to leave or enter the campsite between 22:30 and 06:00 except for emergencies. During the other hours, strict monitoring of movement to and from the campsite will be enforced.

It is imperative that club directors and staff keep an eye on their Pathfinders at all times. Please come up with a security plan for your club in conjunction with the camporee's general safety and security plan.

Security volunteers are to be 20 years and older.

CAMP RULES

- No firewood should be brought to campsite
- No Swimming
- No pets allowed
- No cutting through camp sites
- All generators off by 22:00
- Every camper must wear the Overcomer Camporee wristband at all times to be allowed to move around the campsite and be admitted to participate in camporee activities.
- Each club is responsible for the timely and safe disposal of all garbage from your campsite.
- Each club must follow established procedures for the disposal of gray water from the campsite.
- Food must **NOT** be stored in the sleeping tents during the night.
- Ignitable materials, lighted candles, stoves, heaters, or lanterns are prohibited in tents or left unattended at any time.
- **Open fires are not permitted at individual campsites.**
- No swimming is allowed.
- Hiking outside of our designated campgrounds must be supervised.

Camp New Lowell's Address: [5867 County Rd 9, New Lowell, ON L0M 1N0](#)

- From Hwy 401 take exit 359 to merge onto Hwy 400 North toward Barrie
- Stay on Hwy 400 North and take exit 96B for Dunlop St. West for Angus
- Take Country Road 90 West
- Turn right onto Brentwood Road/ Country Road 10
- Turn left onto Country Road 9
- Stay on Country Road 9 and drive for about 5.5 km to Camp New Lowell
- The camp entrance will be on the left



CLUB FIRST AID TEAM

Each club is required to have its own First Aid team to deal with minor cuts and bruises, and other minor cases. For cases that the club's First Aid team could not handle, the patient should be brought to the Camporee First Aid

Station for medical assessment. It would be the camporee nurse's discretion to either call 911 or simply send the patient to the nearest hospital.

Note: Your club's First Aid Station will be checked as part of the campsite inspection.



FIRE EXTINGUISHER

Each club should have a FIRE EXTINGUISHER (A.B.C. rated) on site. This is one of the points of consideration when your campsite is inspected.



HEALTH & SAFETY GUIDELINES

At Camporee, the safety of all our pathfinders and staff is our top priority. In view of this, the following safety rules must be observed by all campers:

1. The Pathfinder Council is responsible for establishing a supervised First Aid Station on the campground. This First Aid Station will be staffed, on a rotation basis, by volunteer medical personnel from within our clubs.
2. Those who will handle or serve food for your club should do the following:
 - a. Wear masks, gloves and hair nets and beard nets
 - b. Hold a current Food Handlers certificate
3. Physical distancing should still be observed and respected. Wearing of masks is not mandatory but is encouraged.
4. Peanuts and/or peanut products should **NOT** be brought to Camporee in consideration of people who could have an allergic reaction to these products.
5. Any member of a club showing symptoms of Covid-19 will immediately

be quarantined and/or sent home. Remaining club members will be accessed daily.

6. Unless absolutely necessary, and with prior approval, clubs are discouraged from cooking and eating together.
7. Health screening should be done each morning before attending activities and honours.



ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

1. All clubs are responsible for their individual shower facility.
2. Snow cones and snacks are available for sale at the Tuck Shop.
3. All vehicles that will enter Camp New Lowell should be pre-registered with the Security Team. Click [HERE](#) to pre-register.
4. There will be **Drum and Drill demonstration** all clubs with drum and/or drill teams are encouraged to participate. To register your team please email Akeem Favorite at ocdc@ontariopathfinders.ca
5. Garbage and recycle bins, including gray water containers, will be placed at strategic places on the camp. It is recommended that garbage and recyclable items be put in separate bags and disposed properly in appropriate bins.
6. **NO DAY PASSES AVAILABLE.**
7. **All food items and other materials needed for camp must be purchased before coming to Camporee.**
